The Winter's Tale

Theatre for a New Audience is in full swing with William Shakespeare's tragicomedy "The Winter's Tale," directed by OBIE Award-winner Arin Arbus. The production plays through April 15 at Polonsky Shakespeare Center. Shakespeare wrote "The Winter's Tale" after his great tragedies. Leontes, a jealous king, accuses Hermione, his Queen, of infidelity. But unlike "Othello," which ends in tragic deaths, in "The Winter's Tale," Shakespeare invented a new form: half-tragedy, half-comedy, its two parts divided by ...
